




We would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has supported the Foodbank since we opened our doors 6 years ago. The response from our community has been fantastic and we appreciate every donation of food and money that we receive. Without your help we could not carry on the work we have been doing.

This year has been challenging: in the first 5 months of 2019 we saw an increased usage of 60% against the same period in 2018. Although we did see usage drop off in June and July it has now started to increase again and we are currently seeing a larger percentage of families in need.

Universal Credit is a major factor in the increase in need in our area, not just the five week wait for the first payment, but also the long term effect of debts built up during this period. This does not just apply to people who are unemployed but also people who are working and on a low income.

Our long term hope is that the time will come when foodbanks are no longer necessary. In the meantime, along with your support, we will continue to do our best to support those in our community struggling against food poverty. Stewart and Cassie

The number of visitors to our foodbank in 2019 increased by almost 400 from the previous year. This was the biggest annual rise in foodbank visits since we opened in 2013.





Café Connect, our community café

Our foodbank operates a community café every Tuesday morning from 10am to 12 noon, providing a free breakfast of hot rolls, cereal and hot drinks for everyone who attends. The café environment allows us to form close relationships with families and individuals in our local community.

I became treasurer of the Foodbank about two years ago not long after relocating to the Leven area. I have been a treasurer for several charities before so the accounts. wades and banking came as no surprise. The big surprise to me was that there was no core funding from the government or the council to help with the basic funding. In other charities I have been involved with either a considerable part or most of the funding was guaranteed. This is not the case with this project where for five years all the funding has had to be raised by the project itself.



Although most of the food comes from donations locally there is still a considerable cost to be met in paying for the running of the project to achieve the wonderful results it does. Through the efforts of our volunteers and in particular David Henderson, who is the Board member who majors on fundraising, we have managed to get grants from many different charitable bodies to fund us throughout the last five years.

The only guaranteed funding we have had through this time and hopefully into the future have been from the wonderful generosity of a group of local patrons the Friends of the Foodbank. This group is made up of individuals who have committed an amount of money by standing order every month and this funding is the bedrock of the efforts we make to get other funds in. The Friends have helped us from the start to develop the project and allow us to grow so that we now run the café and a schools project. As treasurer I know how much this funding means to us and I thank each and every one of the Friends for their generous giving. In times when everybody has many calls on their spending it is wonderful that you continue to give to us, which allows us to help people when they are at their very lowest point and have nowhere else to turn.


Welcome to our new member of staff

How to use the foodbank



In order to access our foodbank service, the first step is to get a **Foodbank Voucher**. Vouchers can be obtained from a number of agencies such as Citizens Advice, housing support, family centres, health visitors, social services and local charities. If needed, we can put you in touch with a suitable agency.

Donating to the foodbank



Foodbank donations can be made at our premises in Bowling Green Street in Methil during our normal opening hours of 3:30 to 5:30pm every Monday and Friday. Alternatively we have collection points throughout the area in Sainsbury's, Methil and Leven libraries, Bank of Scotland and Nationwide bank branches in Leven, Methil Co-op and Nisa (post office) in Leven. Many local churches and schools also arrange regular food collections. Some items we are regularly in need of are:

Tinned soup, beans and spaghetti

Tinned meats eg stew, mince, ham, corned beef

Tinned vegetables eg peas, sweetcorn, carrots, mixed veg **Milk**, long life UHT

Fruit juice, long life (not refrigerated) and diluting juice

Coffee, small jars or packets preferred

Tea bags, various pack sizes

Jam, various flavours, and marmalade

Snacks, crisps, sweets, etc

Rice, pasta and instant mash potato

Cooking sauce, for pasta and curry

Tinned fish, tuna, salmon, sardines, etc

Rice pudding, custard and sponge pudding

Sugar, small bags

Cereal and porridge, various size packs

Tinned fruit

Ketchup and condiments

Biscuits

Toiletries, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, toilet roll, etc

Laundry and kitchen supplies

Baby supplies, nappies, wipes, etc

Dog and cat food

Seasonal items, eg selection boxes, Easter eggs, etc
